## **Sheriff Baca Endorses Bustamonte for Supervisor**

Art Bustamonte, a former Police Officer for the City of Huntington Park, recently received the endorsement from Lee Baca, Los Angeles County Sheriff.



Bustamonte, who received the endorsement at Baca's office, said, "I am very pleased and proud to have received Sheriff Baca's endorsement for the Board of Supervisors". Baca described Bustamonte as the "right person" to represent the people of the 2<sup>nd</sup> District during these most difficult times.

Bustamonte, who was awarded a ‘Medal of Valor’ for heroism, is challenging incumbent Paul Biane for a seat on the Board. Biane, a co-conspirator in the “Colonies” scandal, has further “tarnished the County’s reputation” with his close ties to the individuals now being prosecuted by the District Attorney and the State Attorney General, Jerry Brown. Brown has called the 102 million dollar “bribery scandal” the largest in San Bernardino County history if not the state.

“It is time for Biane to be removed from office so we can begin to repair our County’s tarnished image. How can we expect to attract business and commerce when we are under a cloud of corruption. Now is the time to bring an end to the ‘Culture of Corruption’ ”, Bustamonte said.
